## Salmon Fishing Trip Saturday May 18th

The cost is \$125 per person for the charter boat which holds a maximum of 23 fishermen (the price drops to \$100 each if we book the entire boat and I have reserved 5 seats initially), \$15 for a 1-day fishing permit, and \$5 per weight (they are lost when catching a fish). The boat leaves at 5am and stays out until 3pm, so driving down Friday afternoon, having dinner and staying in a hotel are recommended as bay area traffic and bridge travel would necessitate and extremely early departure time from Sparks. I included breakfast in the costs and each person will need to bring a sack lunch and drinks or whatever they want to eat during the charter. I also included dinner that evening before traveling home. I have a minivan that can hold 6 passengers and I will drive. Lastly,

The word "Worshipful" is used when addressing the Master of the Lodge. "Worship" is derived from the Old English "worchyppe" or "worchyp" meaning "greatly respected." In the Wycliffe Bible, "Honor thy father and thy mother" appears as "Worchyp thy fadir and thy modir."

Grand Masters are called "Most Worshipful" meaning "Most greatly respected" (except in Pennsylvania where the Grand Master is "Right Worshipful" as are Past Grand Masters both there and in Texas).
